



# Legislative update (2021) Bills signed into law



- School Hardening
  - General Appropriations, \$42,000,000
  - No district may receive less than \$42,000
  - Funds shall be provided based on district application, which must be submitted to the Department of Education by February 1, 2022.



### SB 192 Students with Disabilities in Public Schools

### HB 149 (Similar)

Requiring school districts to prohibit the use of seclusion on students with disabilities in public schools; requiring school districts to adopt positive behavior interventions and supports and certain policies and procedures; creating the Video Cameras in Public School Classrooms Pilot Program; requiring continuing education and inservice training for instructional personnel teaching students with emotional or behavioral disabilities, etc.



# HB 59 Growth Management SB 496 (Similar)

- Requires local governments to include property rights element in their comprehensive plans
- Provides that certain property owners are not required to consent to development agreement changes
- Affords DOT first right of refusal
- authorizes certain developments of regional impact agreements to be amended.



### HB 337 Impact Fees

### SB 750 (Identical)

- Specifies instances when local government or special district may collect impact fee
- Requires local governments & special districts to credit against collection of impact fee any contribution related to public facilities
- Provides annual limitations on impact fee increases



### HB 337 Impact Fees

### SB 750 (Identical)

- Requires school districts to report specified items regarding impact fees;
- Requires specified entities to file affidavit attesting that impact fees were appropriately collected & expended.



# SB 1028 Charter Schools HB 51 (Identical)

- Authorizing state universities College institutions to solicit applications and sponsor charter schools under certain circumstances
- Requires the board of trustees of a state university or Florida College System institution that is sponsoring a charter school to serve as the local educational agency for such school



# SB 1028 Charter Schools HB 51 (Identical)

- Authorizing a career and professional academy to be offered by a charter school, etc.
- Revise the underused, vacant, or surplus facility reporting so that the Department of Education will provide school districts a list of all underused, vacant, or surplus facilities owned or operated by the school district by January 1 annually.



### Student Station Report

- Section 1013.64(6)(b), Florida Statutes (F.S.), requires the Florida Department of Education (DOE) and Florida Legislative Office of Economic and Demographic Research (EDR) to annually review and adjust the cost per student station associated with school construction and to identify an alternative cost index to forecast future construction costs. This report presents the results of DOE and EDR's collaboration to fulfill this statutory requirement for 2020-21


