10.2 - General Description of Facilities & Capital Outlay Data Base (FCODB)


The FCODB consists of three types of records: 1) site, 2) facility, and 3) room. Each record is uniquely identified by its key element(s). These unique identifying numbers reference the physical location of all college facilities.

- The key element for a site is site number.
- The key element for a facility consists of site number and facility number.
- The key element for a room is the combination of site number, facility number, and room number.

The FCODB data is used to prepare the capital outlay budget request, and it is used by each college to prepare the educational plant survey. The facilities data is reported by term, and any changes to the FCODB due to the educational plant survey must be submitted during the three regular open submission periods. When a file is submitted, (site, facility, or room) the entire FCODB must be sent electronically to the Northwest Regional Data Center (NWRDC) through the Florida Information Resource Network (FIRN).

Physical Accessibility

Existing Facilities/Program Accessibility

- Program access for people with disabilities is required for the programs, services, and activities including but nor limited to laboratories, seating accommodations and access to sports complex.
- Not every portion of the facilities must be accessible based on structure and alteration cost, however, path of travel, restrooms, drinking fountains, and egress are areas that should be made accessible.



Physical Accessibility

Federal Accessibility Standards

- Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)
- American National Standards Institute (ANSI)
- Uniform Federal Accessibility Standards (UFAS)



Physical Accessibility

The compliance date for new construction and alterations is determined by:

- New Construction
 - 2010 ADA Standards
- Alterations
 - 1991 and 2010 ADA Standards
 - Path of travel

New construction and alterations must comply either with the 1991 Standards or with the 2010 Standards, if the date when the last application for a building permit or permit extension is certified to complete by the State, county, or local government is on or after September 15, 2010.
